For families with children who are unable to communicate verbally, your donations helped purchase specialized communication devices through the Augmentative and Alternative Communication program.

Providence has 10 therapists who are specially trained to help children communicate, but a therapist may see a child for only one or two hours a week. Providing funds to offset the cost of a communication device means a child has access to this resource wherever and whenever they need.

"A communication device can cost thousands of dollars. As resources are scarce, foundation funds have been a light for families during a very dark time. Your donations helped reduce the financial burden of helping their child grow and thrive," said Darrick Stiff, MS, CCC-SLP, who oversees the Augmentative and Alternative Communication program.
