More heart care, more health care for the north coast

Expanded primary care, plus walk-in care. Heart care and cardiac rehabilitation. A focus on wellness and prevention. All are coming to Warrenton in convenient, remodeled and neighboring clinics to improve the health of our community.

Thanks to your generous donations, health care for the north coast is being reshaped so our patients can more easily access essential services in two expanded clinics near each other – in the same shopping area along Highway 101 in a growing part of Warrenton.

By expanding Providence Warrenton Clinic, north coast patients will have more access to clinicians, walk-in primary care and important cardiac rehabilitation services.

“We’re extremely grateful to our donors,” said Rebecca Coplin, chief executive, Providence North Coast Service Area. “Plus, our team is very excited to serve the community in new and expanded ways.”

The project, opening early 2025, means:

- Providence Warrenton Clinic will move into a refurbished space that will double the current number of patients with primary care and walk-in services.
- Providence Heart Clinic – North Coast, based now in Astoria, will move into the new clinic, allowing patients to receive more care in a single location.

Our existing primary care clinic will be converted to house cardiac rehabilitation and Providence Basecamp, an innovative program for wellness and heart disease prevention new to the north coast.

In 2023, you helped:



Expand and modernize the sterile processing area, in partnership with the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust, increasing safety and allowing the hospital to serve many more patients



Buy two new vehicles for Community Connections, increasing patient transportation trips by 50%



Purchase a medication cart, a LUCAS chest compression system for emergencies and a Glidescope for surgery intubation



Purchase child-sized furniture and games in partnership with Juan Young Trust, to make hospital clinic spaces more inviting for kids



Provide services, a mobile shower and a peer support specialist for those with substance use disorder, in partnership with OHA and OCF



Support medication assistance, rides and dental care for children and families in the region
