In memory of Sister Carolyn Koreski (October 16, 1935 – July 11, 2010)

Sister Carolyn Koreski was well known throughout Providence for being a compassionate and witty leader. A teacher, case worker and patient advocate by profession, she was the first Sister of Providence to serve on staff at St. Helen's Hospital in Chehalis, WA.

From 1985 until her retirement in 2003, she worked at Providence Centralia Hospital as the Sister of Providence Representative and as a patient advocate. "The Scripture talks about saving the best wine until the last. Well, at Providence Centralia, my best job was my last job (as a patient advocate). The people I met there will be my friends forever. I have a deep gratitude to the community for all it has meant to me..." Sr. Carolyn Koreski, SP

In tribute to her many accomplishments and for her extraordinary work as a patient advocate, the Sister Carolyn Koreski Patient Assistance fund was established in 1996 with the purpose to provide support to patients in need.

Every year, the Sister Carolyn Koreski Patient Assistance fund has provided critical funding for the poor and vulnerable, distributing to those who need it most. Since its creation, donations to this fund are used to help with critical needs, especially during patient discharge. The fund has provided families with food insecurity obtain meals, patient transportation, clothing, and temporary boarding for patients with no safe place to go home to while they heal.

Solar Power Super Charges Cost Savings and Energy Efficiency at Providence Centralia Hospital

Thanks to a TransAlta Centralia Coal Transition Grant of \$238,036 awarded to Providence Health Care Foundation, earlier this year Providence Centralia Hospital implemented the state's largest hospital solar panel array. Located on the C Building rooftop, this renewable and clean energy collects 94,000 kilowatt hours of power helping to offset the hospital's energy costs by approximately \$10,000 a year and providing 2% savings on total energy consumption for the hospital. Power generated by the solar panels flows directly into the hospital's power grid, powering the buildings. The solar panels have an approximate lifespan of 25-years which could result in approximately \$442,391 in cost savings.

In 2019, Providence Centralia Hospital and Providence St. Peter Hospital won the Greenhealth Partner for Change Award which recognizes superior performance in environmental sustainability, covering a range of different sustainability programs and activities.

🁛 Over the last 10 years, PCH has been implementing green changes to its operations including upgrading infrastructure such as heating and cooling systems and lighting to be more energy efficient; cutting back on paper use; established an on-site recycling area where employees can find reusable office equipment and supplies; the hospital cafeteria switched from plastic cutlery to biodegradable cutlery made from potato starch for their take-out orders. These green practices have a savings of over \$200,000 a year.



Coming Together:

Providence Southwest Washington Foundations Merge

After lengthy discernment and planning by the Providence Health Care Foundation-Centralia and Providence St. Peter Foundation boards and leadership, the two foundations raising philanthropic funds for Providence Centralia and St. Peter hospitals, Providence Mother Joseph Care Center, Providence SoundHomeCare & Hospice, and Providence Medical Group will combine into one legal entity effective January 2021. Funds designated for the benefit of these ministries, and all future donations, will continue to be held for the direct benefit of the facility or program directed by the donor.



While the foundation staff and leadership were consolidated into one team serving both foundations more than five years ago, the boards and legal structure remained separate. The vote to consolidate the foundations came after more than a year of careful evaluation, with the focus on a future that will provide the most efficient and effective impact on the health care needs of the communities we serve.

In the Hopes and Aspirations document created by the Sisters of Providence to outline their intentions for our ministries going forward, the following guidance has helped inform this decision:

"As transportation and communication bring us closer together, we hope Providence Ministries will embrace a spirit of collaboration, not competition, in service of the Mission. Stewardship of the resources of Providence, our communities, and our society require that we work with others to find new ways to advocate more effectively for the poor and to meet their needs and avoid wasteful duplication. We expect Providence Ministries to search for new ways to carry out the Mission, honoring Providence tradition, but not letting past practice constrict the vision of what is best for the future."

The 33 directors of both boards will join as one to ensure appropriate representation of our five-county service area. Funding allocation formulas to all five local ministries will remain intact and existing and future donations will be restricted precisely as desired by the donor.

As Providence continues to seek efficiencies and opportunities to improve alignment, collaboration and efficiencies to maximize benefit to the populations we serve, the need to combine the two entities became clear. Over time, this will allow reduction of administrative costs and provide a platform for a united effort to address the greatest needs of the communities we serve to impact lasting improvement in the health and wellness of our residents.
