ION Bronchoscopy Technology Available at St. Peter Hospital

"Early diagnosis combined with timely, targeted, and personalized treatment is the key to improve lung cancer survival" said Pulmonologist Dr. Dominique Pepper. With the lon robot, we have diagnosed more smaller and earlier stage lung cancer, which allowed patients to receive radiation, oncology, and thoracic surgery sooner. "Speed really matters in lung cancer treatment. We can now get patients who need it into surgery sooner, and I believe we will now be able to cure more cancers. This truly is a game changer."
